Texas Demographics

Population: 29.1 million

Over 65: 4.8 million or 16.5%

Forecast: 60% increase in 15 years

Visual Disability: 65+ = 13.5%

Normal Vision




The same scene affected by age-related macular degeneration

- Reading disability (i.e., dyslexia)




My Other Library is TBP!





BRAILLE Alphabet







Digital Talking Book Machine (DTBM)

 Books play on cartridges with no moving parts

 Touch buttons control the functions of the machine



BARD: Braille and Audio Reading Download






