

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Overview: Homeland Security and Community Preparedness Planning Project Resolution 1/1/2026 – 12/31/2026

The Texas Association of Regional Councils seeks to continue the submission of the Homeland Security and Community Preparedness Planning Project to the Office of the Governor. The project will continue TARC's work in planning support and associated training with regional councils in the state, which is ongoing and necessary to assist the state and its partner agencies in being more fully integrated and collaborative with the 24 regions and local elected officials as part of the whole community preparedness.

This project will build on the existing organization structure, network, and previous projects administered by TARC to support state, regional, and local planning and prioritization efforts. Grant funds are needed to provide organizational support to raise the preparedness and resiliency levels across the regions and their communities in Texas.

To comply with the grant's submission requirements, TARC is requesting the Board's consideration and approval of the Homeland Security and Community Preparedness Planning Project Resolution 1/1/2026 - 12/31/2026.



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Overview: Homeland Security and Community Preparedness Planning Project Resolution 1/1/2026 – 12/31/2026

WHEREAS, the Texas Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors finds it in the best interests of the 24 councils of government and the citizens of the State of Texas that the TARC Homeland Security and Community Preparedness Planning Project be operated from 1/1/2026 - 12/31/2026; and

WHEREAS, no match is currently required under the terms of this grant. The Texas Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors agrees to provide applicable matching funds for the said project, as required by the State of Texas, Office of the Governor, Preparedness Division if at such a time a match is required; and

WHEREAS, the TEXAS Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, The Texas Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Association of Regional Councils designates Ginny Lewis Ford, Executive Director, Texas Association of Regional Councils, as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Texas Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors approves the submission of the grant application for the TARC Homeland Security and Community Preparedness Planning Project to the Office of the Governor.
