

Application Fact Sheet

Program Overview

The <u>Texas Regional Broadband Program (TRBP)</u> is administered by the Texas Association of Regional Councils (TARC) in partnership with the Texas Broadband Development Office (BDO). This initiative supports the development of regional broadband capacity and digital opportunity planning efforts across Texas. Through the program, each participating Council of Governments (COG) will serve as a regional coordinator, leading outreach, data collection and strategy development to expand broadband access and digital inclusion across their region in collaboration with a consultant serving as the subject matter expert (SME).

While the TRBP emphasizes regional planning and capacity building, COGs that have already completed broadband planning efforts may tailor their participation to advance digital capacity and literacy initiatives within their regions. These activities may include supporting community efforts to expand digital literacy programs, enhance broadband data and mapping, strengthen local coordination among stakeholders, project facilitation, enhancing data readiness and strengthening digital literacy initiatives consistent with BDO guidance.

The COG <u>Application of Interest</u> collects essential information to establish readiness, confirm capacity and document regional broadband priorities. Submissions will inform resource allocation, onboarding and compliance preparation for the program's launch in February 2026.

COG Deliverables

Each participating COG will be responsible for the following core deliverables under the TRBP:

1. Regional Coordination & Engagement

- Convene key stakeholders from local governments, ISP's, education, healthcare, and community organizations.
- Maintain ongoing engagement and report progress to TARC.

2. Regional Digital Opportunity Plan

Develop a three-year plan using the TRBP Plan Template, Checklist and Logic Model.
 Conduct regional needs assessments and set measurable broadband inclusion goals.

3. Reporting & Compliance

- o Track expenditures, activities and progress monthly.
- \circ Support quarterly financial and programmatic reporting (COG → TARC; TARC → BDO).
- Complete the Risk Assessment Questionnaire and participate in KPMG monitoring reviews.

4. Program Management & Fiscal Accountability

- Manage funds according to state grant standards.
- Maintain supporting documentation for all expenses (invoices, receipts, general ledgers, personnel level of effort).
- Submit Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) and Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (ICRA) or Indirect
 Cost Certification (ICC) on an annual basis for the 3-year program term.

5. Capacity Building & Implementation Support

- o Designate a Regional Digital Access Specialist or program staff lead.
- Participate in required webinars, trainings and coordination meetings hosted by TARC and BDO.

6. Implementation-Ready COG Activities

- COGs that have already completed significant regional broadband planning efforts may advance directly into implementation activities.
- These activities may include coordinating with communities and local partners on broadband data collection and mapping, supporting digital literacy and training programs, facilitating community outreach and assisting with the implementation of goals based on the existing objectives and strategies outlined in the plan.
- Implementation deliverables must remain measurable, documented and tied to regional broadband outcomes.

How to Apply

To denote your COG's interest in participating in the program, TARC has worked with the BDO and a workgroup of your peers to develop an application process. Application submission includes completion of the Application of Interest
Form (linked below) and sending the required supporting documents to TARC via email. When complete, this will make up your region's Application of Interest Packet. This information provides essential context about your planning readiness, partnerships and staffing approach.
