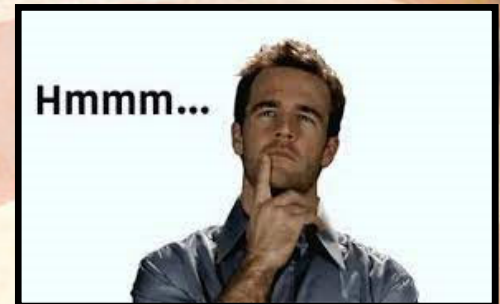


Grants and Resources for Veteran Serving Organizations

Why should I think about having a Veterans Program in my organization?

- Approximately 29.5M people living in Texas as of July 2021
 - Approximately 1.68M are Veterans of the Armed Forces
 - Of these, approximately 1.31M are combat Veterans
 - Of these, approximately 1.25M are age 55 and older

Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program

Title 38 U.S.C. Section 2021

*"...the Secretary of Labor shall conduct, directly or through grant or contract, such programs as the Secretary determines appropriate to provide job training, counseling, and placement services (including job readiness and literacy and skills training) to **expedite the reintegration of homeless veterans** into the labor force."*



The Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program¹ (HVRP) is an employment focused competitive grant program of the Department of Labor, Veterans' Employment and Training Service (DOL-VETS), the only federal grant to focus exclusively on competitive employment for homeless veterans. Initially authorized in 1987 under Section 738 of Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act, HVRP and its companion programs are currently authorized under Title 38 U.S.C. Sections 2021, 2021A and 2023.

Stand Down

Stand Downs are typically one- to three-day events providing supplies and services to homeless Veterans, such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings and VA Social Security benefits counseling. Veterans can also receive referrals to other assistance such as health care, housing solutions, employment, substance use treatment and mental health counseling. They are collaborative events, coordinated between local VA Medical Centers, the Department of Labor (DOL), other government agencies and community-based homeless service providers.



Funding Resources

DOL's Veterans' Employment and Training Service (VETS) awards Stand Down funding through the Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program (HVRP) on an annual basis, pending funding reauthorization.

This noncompetitive grant is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis to support one day or multi-day events at up to \$7,000 or \$10,000, respectively.

Eligible entities include:

- state workforce agencies
- state and local workforce investment boards
- veterans service organizations
- local public agencies and nonprofit organizations, including community and faith-based organizations

Eligible Applicants

Applications for funds will be accepted from State and Local Workforce Investment Boards, Public agencies, non-profit organizations, including faith-based and community-based and neighborhood partnerships. Applicants must have a familiarity with the area and population to be served and the ability to administer an effective and timely program.

*Note that entities organized under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code are not eligible to receive funds under this announcement. Section 18 of the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995, Public Law 104-65, 109 Stat. 691 (2 U.S.C. 1611) prohibits instituting an award, grant, or loan of federal funds to 501(c)(4) entities that engage in lobbying.

Entities that are debarred or suspended shall be excluded from Federal financial assistance and are ineligible to receive a Stand Down grant.

Capacity Building Grants

The Disabled Veterans National Foundation's Capacity Building Grant program provides grants to like-minded organizations who provide support to veterans and disabled veterans alike.

The Capacity Building Grants provide support to our nation's veterans. There's no one-size-fits-all protocol for how a veteran overcomes the mental impacts of war, and outside of the initial recovery from physical wounds, it's often up to the veteran to navigate his or her own way back to a normal life. These grants are awarded to organizations around the country who are addressing the mental and physical recovery of veterans. Service dogs, equine therapy, yoga, art therapy, and recreational therapy are just a few of the innovative programs that DVNF supports. DVNF has two open sessions a year in which they process grants. Organizations may submit their application during these open grant sessions.

VETERAN HOUSING GRANTS

The Foundation's Veteran Housing Grants Program awards grants to nonprofit organizations for the new construction or rehabilitation of permanent supportive housing for veterans. Awards typically range from \$100,000 to \$500,000.

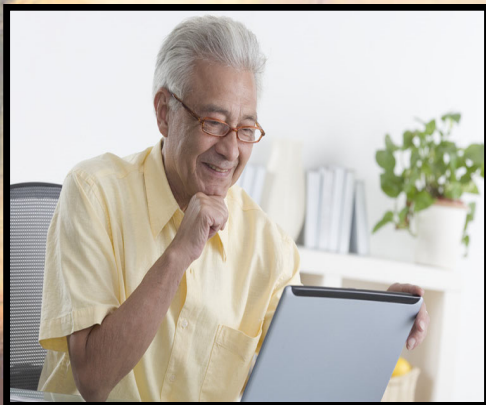

Veteran-Directed Home and Community Based Services



Veteran-Directed Home and Community Based Services

Program for a new Veteran-directed approach to home and community services partnered by:

- U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs
- Central Texas Veterans Healthcare System
- Administration on Community Living
- TX Dept of Aging and Disability Services
- Area Agency on Aging of Central Texas



Eligibility: All enrolled Veterans are eligible for Veteran Directed Care IF they are eligible for community care, meet the clinical criteria for the service, and it is available. Services may vary by location

Veteran-Directed Home and Community Based Services

- **The Veteran** can recruit, hire, train and fire their own employees and backup employees (including family, friends or neighbors)
- **The Veteran** sets wages and benefits for the “employees” based on a service budget created with the help of the AAA VD-HCBS Consultant
- **The Veteran** sets schedules and submits time sheets for the employees to a Fiscal Management Agency (FMS)



The AAA VD-HCBS Services

AAA VD-HCBS Staff assists the Veteran as a Service Consultant and provides activities that will:

- Assist the Veteran to develop a Service Plan appropriate for the Veteran's unique needs
- Orients the Veteran to become an "Employer"
- Assists the Veteran Employer in training and educating the employee's
- Provides support consultation services to the Veteran over length of approved services
- Provides linkage to Financial Management Services (FMS)

These services are provided for 20% of the Veteran's approved budget

The services, supports and goods that a Veteran choose must:

- Help the Veteran meet their functional, medical and/or social needs;
- Help the Veteran to reach the goals “set for yourself”;
- Not be prohibited by federal and state laws and regulations;
- Not be available through another VA source

AND

Do one or more of the following:

- Make it easier for you to do things that are hard because of your disability or health issues; OR
- Increase safety in the Veteran’s home environment; OR
- Lessen the Veteran’s need for other publicly funded services

Financial Benefits of VD-HCBS Services

1. Contract for fee service with the VA
2. Fee is based on Veteran needs
3. You receive a one-time initial assessment fee from the VA per Veteran
4. You get monthly fee from VA for services rendered
5. Remaining Balance of Fees Earned after Covering Administrative Cost can support other ADRC or AAA activity
